



Transitioning Students with Disabilities into Florida's Talent Pipeline



The high school graduation rates for persons with disabilities are improving each year. However, where looking at postsecondary education, we continue to see a lower educational attainment level for persons with disabilities (PuDs). Only 20.4 percent of PWDs attain a bachelor's degree or higher, compared to 3-percent of persons with no disability.

Established in 1990, the vision of The Able Trust is that all Floridians with disabilities achieve their employment potential. As we work in communities across Florida, our youth programs are helping







Post Visibility Settings by Platform

- Facebook & LinkedIn: Can choose privacy settings while creating each post; platform will remember your settings for your next post
- Instagram & Twitter/X: Must set entire profile to be publicly visible

Writing Text for a Post – General Tips

- Keep text concise use the "five W's of journalism" as a guideline for efficient, robust text content
- Use 3-4 sentences of text at most for general posts
- When possible and appropriate, include one or more related photos and/or videos to help your post stand out







Writing Text for a Post – Notes on Web Addresses (URLs)

- Facebook & LinkedIn: If you do not include a photo or video in a post where you share a URL, the platform will show a preview of the site
- Instagram: URLs in the caption text of posts will not link out use a "link in bio" service like Linktree if you want to share links
- Twitter/X: Copied/pasted URLs will only take up about 20 characters (of your 280-character limit) no matter how long they are




Photo Formatting – General Tips

- Across all platforms, square images tend to work well they will not be cropped when the platform scales them to standard sizes
- Holding your phone horizontally when taking photos will reduce the potential of image scaling



Photo Formatting – Instagram

- When posting from a smartphone, you can choose portrait or landscape
 orientation for your photos
 - Horizontal photos landscape is best
 - Vertical photos choose what works best for each image







Filming & Sharing Videos – General Tips

- Holding your phone horizontally to film is best for sharing videos to social media
- Lighting: Your primary light source should ideally be behind you
- Wardrobe: Vivid-colored clothing tends to provide more contrast and show up better on video (unless the setting/background is low-lit)



Filming & Sharing Videos – General Tips

- Start with an engaging hook succinctly tell your audience where you
 are, why you're there, and what you're doing (remember the five W's!)
- Keep it short and sweet Twitter/X in particular has a 2:20 time limit, which is about as long as most people want to spend watching a video while scrolling on any platform
